Description of Duties:

Developing, evaluating and implementing programs, policies and regulations to mitigate climate change and reduce greenhouse gas emissions in accordance with applicable state and federal statutes. Coordinating the compilation and submission of required reports to the General Assembly regarding achieving legislative greenhouse gas reduction targets. Coordinating and convening meetings with stakeholders (state, federal, municipal and/or industrial officials, boards and consultants) to build consensus on climate change mitigation and greenhouse gas emissions reductions strategies consistent with the Department's environmental and energy policies and statutory mandates to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Serving as Department representative on various climate change, environmental and energy advisory boards and committees. Developing and preparing informational and educational materials, grant applications, and other publications. Review and coordinate grant programs to implement strategies to address climate change consistent with the Department's environmental and energy policies and the State of Connecticut's economic development goals. Developing performance metrics and benchmarks to track and report progress in achieving cost effective emission reductions as required by Connecticut's Global Warming Solutions Act of 2008. Coordinating the collection and evaluation of energy and environmental data to compare against established benchmarks and make data driven policy recommendations. Representing the agency by providing both oral and written communications in hearings, meetings and other proceedings at the state, regional and national level to provide support to the Commissioner and to advance Connecticut's climate change and energy goals.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

1. Strong knowledge of state and federal laws and statutes regarding greenhouse gas emissions reduction and climate change adaptation.
2. Considerable knowledge of Connecticut energy policy and the 2013 Comprehensive Energy Strategy,
3. Considerable knowledge of State, Regional, National and climate change policy.

4. Technical ability to develop and evaluate climate change, environmental and energy policies, programs, strategies, regulations, legislation and innovative approaches to quantify and qualify environmental benefits and cost –effectiveness.

6. Excellent interpersonal, oral and written communication skills, with significant experience in public speaking, media relations, and consensus building.
