PURPOSE OF CLASS: This class is accountable for supervising the remedial and custodial services, minor maintenance, building operations and related services in medium sized State institutions (considering size, numbers supervised, and complexity).

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

THIS **PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATION** IS OPEN TO ANY **CURRENT** STATE EMPLOYEE WHO BY **MAY 8, 2014** HAS PERMANENT STATE STATUS SERVICE*, SIX MONTHS STATE SERVICE, AND THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING::

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Five years of experience in building management or in the operation or maintenance of buildings. (**NOTE:** Experience performing technical duties within the maintenance trade area on a military base, aircraft carrier or large compound may be substituted for the General Experience on a year for year basis.)

SPECIAL EXPERIENCE: Three years of the General Experience must have been in a supervisory capacity in either the maintenance of buildings or the military experience referenced above. **NOTE:** For State Employees this is interpreted at or above the level of Supervising Custodian.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Incumbents in this class may be required by the appointing authority to possess and retain appropriate current licenses, permits and/or certifications.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: (1) Incumbents in this class must have adequate physical strength, stamina, physical agility and visual and auditory acuity, and must maintain such physical fitness as to be able to perform the duties. (2) A physical examination may be required.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents may be required to lift; may be exposed to some risk of injury from equipment.

CHARACTER REQUIREMENT: At State Airports: In addition to the checking of references and of facts stated in the application, a thorough background investigation of each candidate may be made before persons are certified for appointment.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES (KSA's): Considerable knowledge of building custodial care, minor maintenance and operations; considerable knowledge of relevant agency policies and procedures; considerable knowledge of relevant State and Federal laws, statutes and regulations; considerable interpersonal skills; oral and written communication skills; ability to inspect and diagnose repair and improvement needs and to recommend and follow through on solutions; ability to handle problems in one or more areas such as security, transportation, or stores; ability to utilize computer software; supervisory ability.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE: In order to be considered for admittance into this examination, you must complete all parts of the examination application (CT-HR-12) detailing how you meet the minimum experience and training requirements stated above. Make certain your application form clearly details your employment history, including job titles, dates of employment and actual job duties as well as college degrees earned and current licenses and certifications. Make certain that your application form is complete and transmitted correctly and without error. Incomplete faxes or faxes received blank because pages were faxed upside down will not be accepted.** Due to the large number of applications received, we cannot confirm receipt of applications. Applications must be date stamped by DAS/Human Resources or postmarked by May 8, 2014. **A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.**

FORMS: Application forms (CT-HR-12) and exam announcements are available from the Department of Administrative Services (<http://das.state.ct.gov/employment>) or at any state agency.
