**PURPOSE OF CLASS:** In a state agency this class is accountable for independently performing a full range of engineering and/or related tasks pertaining to one or more of the following aspects of engineering projects or studies: design, construction, rehabilitation, operation, maintenance, testing and data collection and analysis, planning, research and compliance with regulations.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED**

IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMITTANCE INTO THIS EXAMINATION, YOU MUST INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION THAT YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING BY **DECEMBER 9, 2013**.

**GENERAL EXPERIENCE:** Six years' experience in civil engineering

**SUBSTITUTION ALLOWEDS:** (1) College training in civil engineering may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen semester hours equalling one-half year of experience to a maximum of four years for a Bachelor's degree; (2) A Master's degree in civil engineering may be substituted for one additional year of the General Experience.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENT:** Incumbents in this class may be required to travel.

**WORKING CONDITIONS:** Incumbents in this class may be exposed to some risk of injury or physical harm from construction environments and a moderate degree of discomfort from exposure to year round weather conditions.

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:** Knowledge of and ability to interpret relevant state and federal laws, statutes and regulations; knowledge of relevant engineering standards, principles and practices; knowledge of data collection and analysis techniques; interpersonal skills; oral and written communication skills; ability to prepare, evaluate or review plans, specifications and cost estimates; ability to analyze engineering problems and recommend solutions; mathematical ability.
