Eligibility Requirement: **Candidates must have applied for and passed the ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DIVISION DIRECTOR exam and be on the current certification list promulgated by the Department of Administrative Services for this classification. State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer. Applicants who have not previously taken the exam will not have the opportunity to take the exam prior to the above closing date to qualify for this particular vacancy.**

Description of Duties:

The Director will be responsible for directing the staff and operations of the Inland Water Resources Division. Specific duties will include but not be limited to:

1. managing day to day coordination of water resource planning, permitting, and enforcement, flood management, municipal inland wetlands, and state dam planning, design, and construction;
2. formulating program goals and objectives to enhance water resource management in Connecticut with emphasis on minimizing impacts to water quality and quantity and protecting public safety;
3. developing and overseeing implementation plans for division programs
4. coordinating time critical response to flooding events;
5. building and providing mentorship within the division to develop and expand staff capacity at all levels, with focus on succession planning;
6. coordinating with partners as appropriate, including local, state, and federal governments, including EPA and the US ACOE, non-governmental organizations including watershed groups, interstate flood commissions, and other constituents regarding Connecticut's water resource challenges;
7. representing Connecticut at the regional and national levels.

The Preferred Candidate will have demonstrated:

1. excellent leadership and management skills and experience leading a highly skilled technical workforce;
2. ability to coordinate complex environmental programs, respond to critical events, and balance day to day activities with long term program planning needs;
3. ability to streamline and improve existing processes to enhance efficiency and environmental outcomes;
4. knowledge of state and federal laws and regulations related to environmental quality;
5. experience in water resource planning, permitting, and enforcement; and
6. knowledge and experience in fiscal and personnel management practices.
