State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer.

Description of Duties: This position provides an opportunity to participate in the development of clean air programs for the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection. The successful candidate will develop and implement clean air regulatory programs targeting a variety of air pollution sources. The duties involve working with technical and legal staff as well as stakeholders, evaluating various state and federal regulations, performing legal research, drafting state regulations, and preparing a variety of written documents.

Preferred Candidate Will Have:

- A law degree, with experience or training in environmental or other regulatory programs preferred;
- Understanding of the Clean Air Act;
- Experience or training in interpretation of legislation and regulations;
- Experience or training in regulation adoption and legislative procedures;
