Eligibility Requirement: State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply.

Duties included but not limited to: Function as a Senior Clinician of a multidisciplinary team on the inpatient treatment unit. This individual will supervise clinical staff in the gathering of clinical data, and in developing case formation to design comprehensive treatment plans; accountable for skilled clinical treatment and leadership services involving complex cases and complex system issues. Provides and oversees ongoing in-depth assessment of behavioral health problems to continuously review and adjust treatment plan interventions and evaluate outcomes; provides a wide range of clinical services/intervention on the inpatient unit including individual, family and group counseling, crisis intervention, risk management, psychological testing, and other specialized individual treatment modalities. Incumbent will manage up to eight inpatient clients providing individual and family therapy, case management and discharge planning; Performs other related duties as required.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Considerable knowledge of abnormal and clinical psychology; considerable knowledge and skill in selection, administration, scoring and evaluation of intelligence, achievement, personality and diagnostic tests; considerable knowledge of psychological research methodology including experimental design, data analysis and application of findings; knowledge of other psychological disciplines; considerable interpersonal skills; considerable oral and written communication skills; considerable ability to make clinical diagnosis and prognosis and develop treatment plans; considerable ability to conduct psychotherapy; considerable ability to write case histories, discharge summaries and professional reports; ability to coordinate clinical services with comprehensive and multidisciplinary treatment plans.

General Experience: A doctorate degree in clinical or counseling psychology and one (1) year of post-doctoral experience as a psychologist working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist.

Special Requirement: Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a license to practice psychology in Connecticut. Any person employed by the State of Connecticut prior to July 1, 1985 with a title in the Psychology series of the classified service shall be exempt from the above licensure requirement pursuant to Public Act 613, Section 119(c). For certain positions the appointing authority may require state licensure.

Note: Non-Examined refers to Section 5-219 of the Connecticut General Statutes which permits appointment of candidates to competitive positions without formal examination when a professional license, professional degree, accreditation nor certificate is a mandatory requirement for appointment to a class.

Working Conditions: Incumbents in this class may be required to lift and restrain clients and may have significant exposure to infectious and/or communicable diseases, strongly disagreeable conditions and risk of injury.

Note: Applicants will be selected in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion, collective bargaining unit contract language, merit employment lists and DMHAS affirmative action goals. Therefore, State employees will generally be considered before applicants from outside State service.

To be considered for this position:

1. **DMHAS employees who are lateral transfer candidates** (example: Head Nurse applying to a Head Nurse posting) must submit a completed DMHAS Lateral Transfer Form. Lateral Transfer Request Forms received without a position number will not be processed
2. **DMHAS employees who are promotional/demotional candidates** must submit the State of Connecticut Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). The position number must be noted at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application (CT-HR-12).
3. **All other applicants** must complete a State Employment Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). Resumes and Curriculum Vitae can be provided as supplemental information but will only be accepted if attached to a **fully completed application** (CT-HR-12).
