Duties may include but not limited to: Responsible for the clinical and administrative management of clinical staff including Supervision of assigned professional Nurses and Para- professional. May carry a caseload of selected cases in providing individual, group and family treatment. Completes comprehensive Initial Nursing Assessment, for patients with acute psychiatric and addictive problems, within 8 hours of admission, and throughout hospitalization by utilizing their psychiatric, substance abuse, nursing, and medical knowledge; Assesses, identifies and maintains safety of patients who are at imminent risk to self or others including: Risk to Fall, AWOL Risk, potential or actual substance withdrawal, and medical instability; Describes nursing care needs/problems, in behavioral terms, related to DSM V diagnoses using data collected through the nursing assessment and evaluation processes; individualized nursing care plan in collaboration with the patient, family, significant others, and the multidisciplinary treatment team; Supervises staff in the development of individualized care plans; Administers all medications in accordance with CMHC Standards of Practice and Nursing Policies and Procedures; Conducts and teaches patient debriefing following the use of seclusion and/or restraints in accordance with the Guidelines for Patient Debriefing. May assume Charge Nurse Responsibilities, and Team Leader, responsibilities as assigned. Independently develops, implements and evaluates nursing and/or health care plans; provides nursing consultation; conducts nursing assessments; provides admission and discharge nursing assessments including plans for continuing care; maintains records and makes reports; provides for nursing services to comply with ICF regulations and JCAHO standards; maintains records of stored and secured medications; ensures controlled drugs are properly stored, administered and ordered; independently manages and provides direct care to patients/clients; participates in individual, group or family therapy; participates as a member of an interdisciplinary team in the assessment, development, implementation and evaluation of patient/client treatment or health care plans; may participate in crisis intervention; manages an assigned caseload of other appropriate clinical activities; provides clinical direction and/or training to staff in individual, group and family service delivery programs; may provide in-service training to nursing and paraprofessional staff with regard to signs and symptoms of illness, dysfunction, injury and prevention of same; may conduct patient/client centered conferences with nursing personnel; may consult with and make recommendations to physicians concerning health needs; may make recommendations on policies or standards; may prepare reports or correspondence; performs related duties as required

General Experience and Training: Two (2) years' experience as a Registered Professional Nurse

Special Experience and Training: One (1) year of the General Experience must have been working with the type of patients and/or clients serviced by the agency.

Substitution Allowed: A Bachelor's degree in Nursing may be substituted for one (1) year of the General Experience.

Special Requirement: Must possess and retain a current license as a registered professional nurse in Connecticut. Must possess, retain and carry a valid Connecticut Driver's License. Travel in the community is required.

Eligibility Requirement: State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status or candidates who possess the general and special experience and training may apply.

Note: Applicants will be selected in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion, collective bargaining unit contract language, merit employment lists and DMHAS affirmative action goals. Therefore, State employees will generally be considered before applicants from outside State service.

Application Instructions: DMHAS employees who are lateral transfer candidates (example: Nurse applying to a Nurse posting) must submit a completed DMHAS Lateral Transfer Form. Lateral Transfer Request Forms received without a position number will not be processed. DMHAS employees who are promotional/demotional candidates must submit the State of Connecticut Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). The position number must be noted at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application (CT-HR-12). **All other applicants** must complete a State Employment Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). Resumes and Curriculum Vitae can be provided as supplemental information but will only be accepted if attached to a fully completed application.
