Duties may include but not limited to - Provides comprehensive clinical assessments, risk assessments and medication management services to a 16 bed, locked inpatient psychiatric unit at CRMHC for adults with severe and persistent mental illness. Functions as a leader of the treatment team and provides reviews of recovery plans, clinical records and discharge plans for adherence to policies and Joint Commission standards. Provides clinical leadership to the team in a recovery-oriented manner, participates in meetings on clinical and administrative policy, clinical program development and treatment techniques; assesses, examines, diagnoses and prescribes appropriate medications and other biologic and psychosocial treatments for people with psychiatric or co-occurring disorders, coordinates with primary and specialty care providers, as needed, and performs advanced level risk assessments; consults on difficult and/or complex cases, prepares and/or reviews reports, medical records and correspondence. Additionally, this position will conduct comprehensive outpatient clinical intakes and will work in conjunction with the intake department. This position will participate in on-call coverage and weekend coverage.

For Principal Psychiatrist: General Experience - Incumbents in this class must possess and retain certification as a specialist in psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology or board certification in Adult or Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. **Special Requirements** - Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a license to practice medicine and surgery in Connecticut. A temporary license may be granted for a period not to exceed one (1) year. Incumbents in this class must possess and maintain eligibility for participation in federal health care programs as defined in 42 U.S. 1320a-7b(f). Incumbents in this class may be required to possess and retain certification as a specialist in an area such as geriatrics, ABI/TBI, forensics, substance abuse, etc. Incumbents in this class may be required to possess appropriate current licenses, certifications or permits. Must possess and retain a current valid Connecticut Motor Vehicle Operator License.

For Staff Psychiatrist: General Experience - Graduation from an Accredited Council of Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) psychiatric residency program. **Special Requirements** - Incumbents in this class must obtain certification as a specialist in psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology within five years of appointment to this class OR demonstrate continued competency and proficiency in the practice of psychiatry by successful completing an established agency program. Incumbents in this class must possess and maintain eligibility for participation in federal health care programs as defined in 42 U.S. 1320a-7b(f). Incumbents in this class may be required to possess appropriate current licenses, certifications or permits. Must possess and retain a current valid Connecticut Motor Vehicle Operator License.
