Description of Duties: The Director provides leadership, vision, and creates as well as identifies strategic opportunities to achieve equitably air quality goals under the federal Clean Air Act framework. On a day-to-day basis, provides management and coordination for modeling, attainment planning, air monitoring, and mobile sources programs.

Specific responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Establishing emission budgets and strategies to assure budgets are met
- Representing the State of Connecticut's interests in intergovernmental forums to insure that states contributing to Connecticut's air quality problems carry out reasonable programs
- Developing metrics and benchmarks to compare CT's clean air efforts with others
- Working collaboratively with EPA and multistate organizations to coordinate development of regional solutions to air quality problems
- Conducting long term strategic planning activities to achieve environmental results
- Overseeing ambient air monitoring, capacity development and data analysis to meet future multi-pollutant air quality challenges
- Building and providing mentoring necessary in the Division to expand staff capacity with a focus on transformation and succession

- Strong problem solving skills and be effective at managing change
- Demonstrated experience of rapid progression in scope of responsibility
