Eligibility Requirement: Candidates must have applied for and passed the **Environmental Analyst 2** exam and be on the current certification list promulgated by the Department of Administrative Services for this classification. **Applicants will not have the opportunity to take the exam prior to the above closing date to qualify for this particular vacancy.**

State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer.

Description of Duties:

Assist with agency planning and program development and environmental review responsibilities including but not limited to Environmental Policy Act Project (NEPA) review, CT Environmental Policy Act (CEPA) regulatory development, EPA and state performance partnership agreement/grant, lake drawdown planning and coordination, climate change, planning and preparedness; assist with large economic development projects; assist with support of the Department of Transportation's implementation of Let's Go CT: Governor Malloy's Vision for CT's Transportation Future that outlines the investments needed to make our transportation system safer, more reliable, and more responsive to our 21st century lifestyles and tremendous economic opportunities; coordinate, plan, review and approve DOT's future 5-year project plans advancing through planning, design and construction phases; conduct site visits and evaluations; assist with the development and evaluation of enforcement and compliance assurance policies, practices and tools for the agency; assist the agency's enforcement, permitting and compliance assistance programs in strategic planning and the development of compliance initiatives that address an identified environmental or regulatory challenge; attend public hearings and informational nightly meetings; research and make recommendations for improvements on matters pertaining to legislation, regulations, permitting, enforcement and compliance assistance; assist in the development of effective environmental and performance based measures; support agency-wide Information Technology, Geographic Information System and process improvement (LEAN) efforts; an coordinate and communicate environmental practices and trends with other operating units, agencies, municipal, state and federal governments, the regulated community, and other stakeholders; perform related duties as required.

Preferred Candidate will have:

- Very good interpersonal, oral and written communication skills and proficient information technology skills.

- Experience communicating technical, regulatory, policy or operation information to wide variety of audiences in a clear and understandable manner.
- Experience reviewing, developing and implementing policies and innovative approaches to address compliance assurance challenges.
- Experience in project planning and management critical thinking, and developing effective environmental and performance based measures.

Six (6) years of experience involving technical analysis and interpretation of environmental program data or planning and implementing environmental programs.

College training in a scientific or technical discipline related to the environmental field including but not limited to the biological, earth, or physical sciences; environmental planning; environmental law; economics; leisure services; geographic information systems; geography with a concentration in geographic information systems; natural sciences; or natural resources may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen (15) semester hours one half (1/2) year of experience to a maximum of four (4) years for a Bachelor's degree.

A Master's degree in a scientific or technical discipline related to the environmental field including but not limited to the biological, earth, or physical sciences; environmental planning; environmental law; economics; leisure services; geographic information systems; geography with a concentration in geographic information systems; natural sciences; or natural resources may be substituted for five (5) years of the General Experience.

For State Employees one (1) year of experience as an Environmental Analyst 1 may be substituted for the General Experience.
