Eligibility Requirement: Candidates must have applied for and passed the Environmental Analyst 2 exam and be on the current certification list promulgated by the Department of Administrative Services for this classification. State employees may apply for lateral transfer if they currently hold the title of Environmental Analyst 2, or have attained permanent status in that job class.

Description of Duties:

This position will be responsible for providing environmental analysis in support of permitting for Water Diversion, Inland Wetlands and Watercourses, 401 Water Quality Certification, Dam Safety and Flood Management regulatory programs. Duties will include:

- Review and analyze effects of water resource and land use development projects on natural resources including wetland, wildlife, fisheries, and aquatic resources
- Evaluate projects for consistency with environmental laws, regulations and policies
- Review and analyze permit applications seeking authorization for regulated wetland and water resource activities
- Evaluate and develop project modifications and alternatives to avoid, minimize and mitigate impacts to natural resources
- Conduct site investigations
- Assess existing and proposed site conditions
- Research, collect and analyze natural resource data
- Prepare written documents including environmental permits, environmental impact assessments, legal notices, and correspondence
- Provide testimony on natural resources and environmental issues at public hearings.

The preferred candidate will have:

- Interdisciplinary academic training in natural resources, including wetlands, soils, water resources, watershed hydrology, fish and wildlife biology, ecology and forestry;
- Experience with the principles and practices of environmental regulation specific to the management and use of water resources;
- Experience analyzing and evaluating effects of water resource and land use development on wetlands, fish, wildlife, water quality, streamflow, water-based recreation, water supply and other water;
- Experience writing technical reports and environmental impact statements dealing with water resources, wetlands, fish and wildlife resources, land use and water resource development, or related biological and ecological issues; and
- Strong oral and written communication skills.
