**PURPOSE OF CLASS:** In the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, this class is accountable for supervising an engineering unit engaged in design, construction, testing, and data collection/analysis, planning, research, and permit process activities, performing engineering tasks in waterflow and flood control and in the design and construction of dams and flood control structures with consideration of environmental consequences. **The immediate opening is located in the Support Services Division accountable for supervising an engineering unit engaged in performing engineering investigations and studies of Department facilities such as buildings, foundations, parking lots, boat launching facilities, piers, dams, drainage systems, and seawalls.**

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED**

IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMITTANCE INTO THIS EXAMINATION, YOU MUST INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION THAT YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING BY JULY 31, 2013:

**GENERAL EXPERIENCE:** Eight years of experience as an engineer in work related to water resource management, civil or soils engineering.

**SUBSTITUTIONS ALLOWED:** (1) College training in civil engineering may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen semester hours equaling one-half year of experience to a maximum of four years for a Bachelor's degree. (2) A Master's degree in civil engineering may be substituted for one additional year of the General Experience.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:** (1) Incumbents in this class may be required to travel. (2) Incumbents in this classification, involved with the certification of plans and documents, must possess and retain a current Connecticut Professional Engineer's Certificate of Registration.

**WORKING CONDITIONS:** Incumbents in this class may be exposed to some danger of injury or physical harm from highway or construction environments and a moderate degree of discomfort from exposure to year-round weather conditions.

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:** Considerable knowledge of relevant agency policies and procedures; considerable knowledge of relevant State and federal laws, statutes, and regulations; considerable knowledge of principles, practices, and methods of design, construction and maintenance of dams, or marine and building construction; considerable knowledge of principles of hydraulics, hydrology, and civil or soils engineering; knowledge of practices and methods for controlling floods and encroachments on river channels; considerable interpersonal skills; considerable oral and written communication skills; considerable ability to plan and organize detailed investigations of engineering problems and recommend solutions with consideration for related environmental factors; supervisory ability.

Your examination will only be scored if you meet the minimum experience and training requirements outlined above and your completed application form is date stamped by DAS/Human Resources or postmarked by July 31, 2013. A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.
