Eligibility Requirements: To be considered for this position a candidate must have earned, by the time of hire, a Bachelor degree in civil, chemical, or sanitary engineering with course work in waste management or sanitary or soils engineering.

This ENGINEER INTERN position offers on-the-job training in professional engineering under the direct supervision of an agency Sanitary Engineer. By participating in engineering tasks, the ENGINEER INTERN will acquire knowledge and experience needed to be promoted to Sanitary Engineer 1 upon satisfactory completion of the one- to two-year Intern training period.

Description of Duties:

This position is responsible for assisting staff of a higher grade in:

- Review of engineering reports, plans, and specifications related to the conveyance and treatment of wastewater;
- Field investigations at sites of existing and proposed wastewater treatment and disposal systems; and
- Initiation of enforcement actions to bring non-compliant dischargers into compliance with applicable laws and regulations; and may
- Represent the Department at public hearings, meetings and court proceedings;
- Work with municipal, federal, and other state agency officials; and
- Perform other tasks as necessary to meet the Department's statutory responsibilities related to wastewater permitting and enforcement.

Preferred candidates will have had course work or experience in chemical, civil, environmental, or sanitary engineering; water pollution control or wastewater treatment; hydraulics and/or hydrology; stream water quality modeling; and interpreting and enforcing environmental laws and regulations. In addition, the successful candidate will have good project management skills, proficiency in MS Office and water modeling applications, and will have the ability to prioritize and track multiple tasks, communicate effectively orally and in writing, and work with others in a professional manner.
