Eligibility Requirements:

Candidates must be on the current DAS exam certification list for Environmental Compliance Specialist 2. Current state employees who hold permanent status in the class of Environmental Compliance Specialist 2 may apply without taking the exam. Candidates on Reemployment/SEBAC lists will be given first consideration. **Applicants will not have the opportunity to take the exam prior to the above closing date to qualify for this particular vacancy.**

Description of Duties:

This position will be responsible to:

- Conduct onsite underground storage tank (UST) inspections to determine compliance with regulatory requirements;
- Investigate, gather evidence, and perform related activities to evaluate UST system failures;
- Evaluate operations and equipment to identify malfunctions or noncompliance;
- Prepare inspection reports and assist in preparation of enforcement documents;
- Participate in preparation for and provide testimony at administrative and legal proceedings;
- Investigate and respond to complaints and referrals regarding USTs;
- Interface with other governmental officials and the general public on matters related to USTs and UST compliance;
- Respond to requests for technical and general information regarding UST systems;
- Attend meetings and training events.

Working Conditions:

- Year round field work in adverse conditions including weather, site, terrain, and other physically challenging conditions.
- May require overnight travel.

The preferred candidate will have:

- Ability to effectively communicate in person, on the phone, and in writing with a variety of constituents including the public, the regulated community, and other agencies regarding UST issues;
- Ability to effectively organize and present technical information and data;
- Ability to read and interpret statutes and regulations related to UST compliance;
- Knowledge of equipment related to UST systems such as construction materials, methods of release detection and prevention, and system configurations;
- Mechanical aptitude;
- Ability to use hand tools such as crow bars, wrenches, pliers, and hammers.
- Knowledge of and experience with safety issues related to environmental fieldwork, such as personal protective equipment, and work site awareness, such as trench safety, safe lifting techniques, and traffic control;
- Knowledge of and skill using UST-related databases, GIS, and word processing;
- Knowledge of and experience in well and product sampling and in methods of collecting samples, including soil and surface water.

Note: The filling of this position will be in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion and merit employment rules, if applicable.
