PURPOSE OF CLASS: In the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, Bureau of Air Management this class is accountable for independently performing a full range of tasks in the installation, maintenance, and modification of meteorological, telemetry, and air sampling equipment.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

THIS PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATION IS OPEN TO ANY **CURRENT** EMPLOYEE OF THE **DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION** WHO BY **APRIL 11, 2014** HAS PERMANENT STATUS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE, SIX MONTHS SERVICE IN THE **DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION**, AND THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Six years of experience in the installation, calibration, operation and maintenance of chemical, mechanical and electronic equipment and instruments.

SUBSTITUTION ALLOWED: College training in electronics, physics, chemistry or engineering technology with courses in air pollution control or air sampling and monitoring may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen semester hours equaling one-half year of experience to a maximum of four years for a Bachelor's degree.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: (1) Incumbents in this class may be required to travel. (2) Incumbents in this class may be required to possess and retain a valid Motor Vehicle Operator's license.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: (1) Incumbents in this class must have adequate physical strength, stamina, physical agility and visual and auditory acuity, and must maintain such physical fitness as to be able to perform the duties. (2) A physical examination may be required.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents in this class may be exposed to a moderate degree of injury or physical harm due to falls or lifting of heavy equipment or from dangerous fumes; may also be exposed to a moderate degree of discomfort from environmental conditions and equipment noise.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Considerable knowledge of chemical, electrical, and/or mechanical principles and techniques involved in the operation, calibration, and repair of meteorological, telemetry, and air pollution sampling equipment; considerable knowledge of electronic test equipment; knowledge of air pollution control laws, rules, and regulations; ability to use standard hand and power tools; knowledge of basic laboratory techniques/procedures; skill in equipment installation, repair, troubleshooting, and modification techniques; basic interpersonal skills; oral communication skills; ability to operate field/laboratory testing equipment; ability to interpret data, charts, and graphs; ability to utilize computer software.

A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.**
