Preferred Skills:

- Experience conducting infectious disease follow-up of case-reports or comparable experience.
- Experience collecting disease surveillance data and maintaining a surveillance database.
- Experience conducting infectious diseases outbreak investigations including interviewing of cases and/or controls, database development, data entry and analysis, and preparation of summary reports of findings.
- Experience communicating with healthcare providers, local health department officials, and the general public.
- Experience with data management and ability to use computer software (including Excel, Epi Info, and/or SAS) for epidemiologic analysis.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

Knowledge, Skill and Ability: Knowledge of relevant disease processes which affect humans and animals; knowledge of epidemiological methods; knowledge of basic biological processes; interpersonal skills; oral and written communications skills; ability to research scientific literature and develop and gather data. Knowledge of infectious/chronic disease epidemiology.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING

General Experience: Five (5) years' experience in a responsible technical or professional capacity in epidemiological investigations.

Substitution Allowed: 1. College training may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen (15) semester hours equaling one-half (1/2) year of experience to a maximum of four (4) years for a Bachelor's degree. 2. A Master's degree in a related discipline including community medicine, public health or a related health science may be substituted for the General Experience. 3. A Doctorate in a related discipline such as medicine, public health or a natural or behavioral science may be substituted for the General Experience.

Special Requirement: 1. Incumbents in this class must be willing to be immunized for communicable diseases as necessary and appropriate. 2. Incumbents in this class may be required to travel.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents in this class may be exposed to communicable diseases and hazardous substances.
