Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Experience in conducting computer forensic investigations/examinations using industry based forensic tools. Ability to strictly adhere to established standard operating procedures in a laboratory environment while performing digital data acquisitions, analysis on wide variety of electronic devices and issue technical reports. Knowledge and experience with a wide variety of computer operating systems and network environments including Windows, OSX, and Linus. Ability to conduct forensic exams on computers, tablets, electronic media, mobile phones and related electronic devices. Familiar with forensically searching for and recovering information that may have been deleted, hidden or lost. Knowledge in network operating systems and serves, file/data extraction is preferable.

Eligibility Requirement: **Candidates must have applied for and passed the Forensic Science Examiner 1 exam and be on the current certification list promulgated by the Department of Administrative Services. State employees currently holding the Forensic Science Examiner 1 or those who have previously attained permanent status in this class may apply for a lateral transfer. Applicants will not have the opportunity to take the exam prior to the above closing date to qualify for this particular vacancy.**
