**PURPOSE OF CLASS:** In the Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Division, this class is accountable for providing the most complex consultative services to all employers regarding occupational health or inspecting and investigating public employers for compliance with Connecticut Occupational Safety and Health Act.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED**

IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMITTANCE INTO THIS EXAMINATION, YOU MUST INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION THAT YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING BY **OCTOBER 23, 2012:**

**GENERAL EXPERIENCE:** Seven years of experience in occupational health.

**SUBSTITUTIONS ALLOWED:** (1) College training in chemistry, occupational health, physics or a closely related field may be substituted for the General Experience on the basis of fifteen semester hours equaling one-half year of experience to a maximum of four years for a Bachelor's degree. (2) A Master's degree in industrial hygiene, public health or a closely related field may be substituted for one additional year of the General Experience.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:** (1) Incumbents in this class may be required to travel. (2) Incumbents in this class may be required to possess and retain a valid Motor Vehicle Operator's license.

**WORKING CONDITIONS:** Incumbents in this class may be exposed to moderately disagreeable and hazardous conditions.

**KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:** Considerable knowledge of principles and practices of occupational health; considerable knowledge of state and federal Occupational Safety and Health Act and standards; considerable knowledge of investigation methods and techniques; knowledge of instrument use and calibration; knowledge of research methods and techniques; basic knowledge of toxicology; considerable oral and written communication skills; interpersonal skills; ability to utilize computer software.

Your examination will only be scored if you meet the minimum experience and training requirements outlined above and your completed application form is date stamped by DAS/Human Resources or postmarked by October 23, 2012. A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.
