PURPOSE OF CLASS: At Central Connecticut State University this class is accountable for independently performing a full range of duties in the cogeneration power plant.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

IN ORDER TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMITTANCE INTO THIS EXAMINATION, YOU MUST INDICATE ON YOUR APPLICATION THAT YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING BY NOVEMBER 26, 2012:

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Three years of experience in a cogeneration power plant or industrial setting including the operation, maintenance and repair of high pressure steam boilers, heat recovery steam generators or other mechanical equipment.

SUBSTITUTIONS ALLOWED: (1) Graduation from a vocational or technical school with a diploma in a related field may be substituted for two years of the General Experience. (2) College training in mechanical engineering or a related field may be substituted for the general experience on the basis of fifteen semester hours equaling one-half year of experience to a maximum of three years for a Bachelors degree.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents in this class may be required to lift moderate to heavy weights, use protective equipment such as respirators and safety goggles and may be exposed to significant levels of noise, dust, heat and risk of injury from equipment and or environmental conditions.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Knowledge of theory and application of high pressure boilers, heat recovery steam generators, reciprocating engines and auxiliary systems; knowledge of industrial instrumentation and control systems; interpersonal skills; oral and written communication skills; ability to read and interpret piping and instrument diagrams, electrical one-line, schematic and logic diagrams; ability to apply some principles of physics, chemistry, thermodynamics, heat transfer, fluid flow and combustion; ability to utilize computer software.

APPLICATION AND EXAMINATION PROCEDURE: In order to be considered for admittance into this examination, you must complete all parts of the examination application (CT-HR-12) detailing how you meet the minimum experience and training requirements stated above. Make certain your application form clearly details your employment history, including job titles, dates of employment, hours worked per week and actual job duties as well as college degrees earned and current licenses and certifications. **THIS MATERIAL WILL CONSTITUTE THE EXAMINATION FOR THIS CLASS.** Your examination will only be scored if you meet the minimum experience and training requirements outlined above and your completed application form is date stamped by DAS/Human Resources or postmarked by November 26, 2012. **A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.** Mail applications to DAS/Human Resources, Room 404, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT. 06106-1658 (Secure Fax #860-622-2875). **If faxing materials make certain that your application form is complete and transmitted correctly and without error.
