Duties may include but not limited to: Performs a full range of psychological services for clients of FSD including diagnostic testing, psychological measurement and evaluation, and psychotherapy; be an integral part of mobile crisis and crisis intervention team and functions as the team leader in the absence of team supervisor; responds to crisis calls, and provides crisis evaluation and emergency certification for individuals experiencing mental health crises in the community; provides education and training to local enforcement for improving awareness, sensitivity, and response to individuals experiencing mental health crises; administers and interprets psychological tests for assigned clients of FSD; prepares psychological evaluation reports and formulates treatment recommendations; may provide training and consultation to staff of FSD; delivers services which are person centered, recovery oriented, trauma sensitive, and cultural competent; documents services and compliance with agency policies and procedures, state, federal and Joint Commission regulations and guidelines; may provide psychotherapy; may supervise student interns and staff of lower job class and performs other related duties as assigned.

General Experience: A doctorate degree in clinical or counseling psychology and one (1) year of post doctoral experience as a psychologist working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist.

Special Requirement: Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a license to practice psychology in Connecticut. Any person employed by the State of Connecticut prior to July 1, 1985 with a title in the Psychology series of the classified service shall be exempt from the above licensure requirement pursuant to Public Act 613, Section 119(c). For certain positions the appointing authority may require state licensure.

Eligibility Requirement: State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status or candidates who possess the general and special experience and training may apply.

Note: Applicants will be selected in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion, collective bargaining unit contract language, merit employment lists and DMHAS affirmative action goals. Therefore, State employees will generally be considered before applicants from outside State service.

Application Instructions: DMHAS employees who are lateral transfer candidates (example: **Psychologist (Clinical)** applying to a **Psychologist (Clinical)** posting) must submit a completed DMHAS Lateral Transfer Form. Lateral Transfer Request Forms received without a position number will not be processed. DMHAS employees who are promotional/demotional candidates must submit the State of Connecticut Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). The position number must be noted at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application (CT-HR-12). All other applicants must complete a State Employment Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). Resumes and Curriculum Vitae can be provided as supplemental information but will only be accepted if attached to a fully completed application.
