Duties included but not limited to: The duties of this position include but are not limited to: Participates in and coordinates consulting psychology services involving behavior modification. Provides consultation on difficult assignments and psychological testing for young adults with mental illnesses, personality disorders, developmental disorders, the sequelae of trauma and addictions. Participates in multidisciplinary treatment teams. Writes psychological testing reports and provides feedback to professional and paraprofessional staff. Consults with community agencies and organizations requesting psychological assessments. Conducts training sessions for professional and paraprofessional staff. Participates in monthly psychologists meeting and may be asked to conduct evaluations. May be required to attend monthly psychologist meeting at OOC.

Eligibility Requirement: State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer.

General Experience: A doctorate degree in clinical or counseling psychology and one (1) year of post doctoral experience as a psychologist working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist.

Special Requirement: Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a license to practice psychology in Connecticut. Any person employed by the State of Connecticut prior to July 1, 1985 with a title in the Psychology series of the classified service shall be exempt from the above licensure requirement pursuant to Public Act 613, Section 119(c). For certain positions the appointing authority may require state licensure. Incumbent must possess, retain, and carry valid Connecticut driver's license. Travel in community required.

Note: The filling of this position will be in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion and merit employment rules, if applicable.

Application Instructions: Due to the large number of lateral transfer forms and applications received, it is extremely important to note the **Position Number (found on the posting)** on the DMHAS Lateral Transfer Request Form (**upper right-hand corner**) and at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application for Examination or Employment (CT-HR-12).

Lateral Transfer Request Forms received without a position number will not be processed **DMHAS employees who are promotional/demotional candidates** must submit the State of Connecticut Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). The position number must be noted at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application (CT-HR-12). **All other applicants** must complete a State Employment Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). Resumes and Curriculum Vitae can be provided as supplemental information but will only be accepted if attached to a fully completed application.
