The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection's Deputy Director of Identification directs the operations and staff of Identification Services which is responsible for Firearms/Tool marks, Latent Prints, Document and Imprint, Electronic and Digital Imaging, and Computer Forensic Units.

**General Duties & Responsibilities:**

Directs staff and operations of the Firearms, Latent Prints and Automated Fingerprints Identification System (AFIS), Electronic and Digital Imaging, Question Documents and Imprint and Computer Forensic Units; coordinates, plans and manages division activities; formulates program goals and objectives; develop and assist in development of related policies and procedures of the section in conjunction with the American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board (ASCLD/LAB) International; interprets and administers pertinent laws; ensures all instruments and techniques are validated according to established standards; coordinates preparation for section external audits; oversees grant administration; researches new methodology and modifies existing technology; evaluates staff; prepares the section budget; maintains contacts with individuals both within and outside of division who might impact on program activities; serves as the liaison to the Connecticut Criminal Justice community on identification issues; ensures planning and maintenance of professional development and training requirements; provides expert testimony; performs related duties as required.

**General Experience:**

A Masters Degree in Forensic Science or a closely related field and nine (9) years of professional experience in forensic analysis of evidentiary material. Three (3) years of the general experience must have been in a supervisory capacity guiding the activities of professional forensic science laboratory personnel.

**Special Requirement:**

Incumbents in this class may be required to travel, work flexible hours and be willing to periodically undergo tests or immunizations for communicable diseases.
