In the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, Division of Scientific Services, this class is accountable for receiving, examining and conducting complex analyses of physical evidence resulting from all manners of criminal actions.

NOTE: Incumbents are responsible for performing complex analysis of forensic biology evidence.

Eligibility Requirement: **Candidates must have applied for and passed the Forensic Science Examiner 1 exam and be on the current certification list promulgated by the Department of Administrative Services. State employees currently holding the Forensic Science Examiner 1 or those who have previously attained permanent status in this class may apply for a lateral transfer. Applicants will not have the opportunity to take the exam prior to the above closing date to qualify for this particular vacancy.**

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities: Examination of evidence from sexual assault cases, homicides, assaults and other crimes that involve the exchange of blood and body fluids. Evidence submitted may include sexual assault kits, clothing, bedding and weapons. This evidence must undergo written and photographic documentation and be painstakingly examined for trace materials, blood or body fluids utilizing chemical and instrumental testing methods. A written report of scientific findings is compiled and courtroom testimony may be required during the prosecution of the case. Good observational, analytical, critical thinking and communication skills are required.

Note: The filling of this position will be in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion rules.
