Duties may include but not limited to: Oversees and coordinates the work of the Mobile Crisis Team; Assists in determining goals, objectives and priorities, including high risk intervention plans, MCT treatment plans, and pre-crisis planning with staff, clients and available collateral individuals, as appropriate; Assists and participates in team problem-solving; Develops relationships with and assists in the role of liaison to other operating units within the Agency; Monitors the quality of client care to determine effectiveness and necessity for continued crisis supportive services; Assists in the selection, training, and development of staff; Supervises and conducts staff performance evaluations. Leads staff meetings. May assist in conducting crisis assessments, both on-site and in community settings, and in providing crisis phone support; May provide individual and family psychotherapy. Participates in clinical case conferences and other relevant meetings. May assist in providing crisis-related training for local law enforcement. Assists in the oversight of Respite in the absence of other supervisory staff. Reports to the CASP Program Director. May serve as the On-Call Administrator for the Community Acute Services Program.

Eligibility Requirement: State employees currently holding the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer.

General Experience: Seven (7) years of professional health care experience in a psychiatric setting.

Special Experience: Two (2) years of the General Experience must have been at a lead level responsible for coordinating the work of a unit or team of professionals in a psychiatric setting.

Note: For State Employees the lead level is interpreted at the level of a Clinical Social Worker Associate for social work discipline, Head Nurse for the nursing discipline, an Associate Professional Counselor and an Associate Marriage and Family Therapist.

Special Requirement: Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a current license as a Clinical Social Worker, a licensed Marital and Family Therapist, a licensed Professional Counselor, or as a Registered Professional Nurse in the State of Connecticut; Incumbents must possess and retain a current motor vehicle operator's license; may be required to travel.

Working Conditions: Incumbents in this class may be required to lift and restrain clients, may have significant exposure to communicable and/or infectious diseases and risk of injury and may be exposed to strongly disagreeable conditions. **Note:** The filling of this position will be in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion and merit employment rules, if applicable.
