Duties may include but are not limited to: Provides unit-based duties including direct care services to patients, individual and group therapy interventions, and psychological assessments. Provides supervision of the psychologists and students in the Whiting Forensic Division/Dutcher Service, including both Supervisor 1 Psychologist positions and unit Psychologist positions. Formulates and oversees quality assurance efforts in the forensic service. Acts as a liaison between psychology and other disciplines in the forensic division. Represents the department at administrative meetings, and acts as a liaison between psychology and other disciplines in the forensic division. Serves as a member of Whiting Forensic Division/Dutcher Service and Hospital Divisional Review Committees, and provides consultation to inpatient treatment teams and other hospital staff. Monitors additional psychological services as they are implemented throughout the division (psychotherapy, behavioral interventions, neuropsychological assessment, problem sexual behavior evaluations).

Performs as the primary behavioral management resource to the treatment team including the design and implementation of behavioral treatment interventions and direct care staff education in such interventions. Leads Behavioral Rounds on the unit to address specific patient conduct issues with emphasis upon immediate and timely interventions involving all treatment team members and direct care staff. Acts as a primary liaison to the Behavioral Intervention Service to ensure timely consultation and interventions. With the Director of Psychology, helps determine forensic psychology's priorities and plans, and coordinates and supervises program activities; helps develop performance standards and completes staff performance appraisals. Helps develop or assist with the creation of policies, procedures, and standards for forensic services in the WFD; Provides in-service educational presentations to staff regarding forensic services and the PSRB. Performs related duties as required.

Eligibility Requirement: State employees who possess the general and special experience and training, currently hold the above title or those who have previously attained permanent status in the above title may apply.

General Experience and Training: A Doctorate degree in Clinical or Counseling Psychology and three (3) years of post-doctoral experience as a licensed clinical psychologist.

Special Requirements: Incumbents in this class must possess and retain a license to practice psychology in Connecticut. Any person employed by the State of Connecticut prior to July 1, 1985 with a title in the psychology series of the classified service shall be exempt from the above licensure requirements pursuant to Public Act 613, Section 119 (c). For certain positions, the appointing authority may require State licensure.

Note: Applicants will be selected in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion, collective bargaining unit contract language, merit employment lists and DMHAS affirmative action goals. Therefore, State employees will generally be considered before applicants from outside State service.

Application Instructions:

Due to the large number of lateral transfer forms and applications received, it is extremely important to note the **Position Number (found on the posting)** on the DMHAS Lateral Transfer Request Form (**upper right-hand corner**) and at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application for Examination or Employment (CT-HR-12)

To be considered for this position:

1. **DMHAS employees who are lateral transfer candidates** (example: Mental Health Assistant 1 applying to a Mental Health Assistant 1 posting) must submit a completed DMHAS Lateral Transfer Form. Lateral Transfer Request Forms received without a position number will not be processed
2. **DMHAS employees who are promotional/demotional candidates** must submit the State of Connecticut Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). The position number must be noted at the bottom of Page One of the State of Connecticut Application (CT-HR-12).
3. **All other applicants** must complete a State Employment Application for Examination and Employment (CT-HR-12). Resumes and Curriculum Vitae can be provided as supplemental information but will only be accepted if attached to a fully completed application.
