PURPOSE OF CLASS: In a state agency this class is accountable for supervising the operation, maintenance and repair of high pressure steam heating and power plants and auxiliary utilities in large state institutions.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

THIS PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATION IS OPEN TO ANY **CURRENT** STATE EMPLOYEE WHO BY **APRIL 21, 2016** HAS PERMANENT STATE STATUS*, SIX MONTHS STATE SERVICE, AND THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Seven years of experience in the operation, maintenance and repair of steam heating and generating equipment.

SPECIAL EXPERIENCE: Three years of the General Experience must have been in a lead capacity. **NOTE:** For State Employees this is interpreted at the level of Lead Stationary Engineer.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Incumbents in this class may be required by the appointing authority to possess and retain appropriate current licenses, permits and/or certifications.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: (1) Incumbents in this class must have adequate physical strength, stamina, physical agility and visual and auditory acuity, and must maintain such physical fitness as to be able to perform the duties. (2) A physical examination may be required.

WORKING CONDITIONS: (1) Incumbents in this class may be exposed to significant levels of noise, dust, and heat and may be exposed to risk of injury from equipment. (2) The appointing authority may require completion of an asbestos removal program consistent with EPA guidelines for operations and maintenance during employment in this class. Incumbents may be required to use protective equipment such as respirators and safety goggles.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES (KSA'S): Considerable knowledge of and ability to operate, maintain, inspect and make running repairs to boiler and engine room, generating and related mechanical equipment; considerable knowledge of and ability to maintain building utility equipment including power, light, water, sewage, steam and plumbing lines; considerable knowledge of relevant state and federal laws, statutes and regulations; considerable interpersonal skills; oral and written communication skills; ability to utilize computer software; supervisory ability.

Incomplete faxes or faxes received blank because pages were faxed upside down will not be accepted.** Due to the large number of applications received, we cannot confirm receipt of applications. **Examination scores will be mailed by **JUNE 2, 2016**.** **A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.**
