There is a Transportation Principal Engineer (Engineering) opportunity currently available in the Bureau of Engineering and Construction, Division of Facilities and Transit, located in the Newington Administration Building. This position is in the P-4 bargaining unit. **Possession of a Professional Engineer's license, as outlined below, is an absolute requirement.**

Position Description: This position is responsible for supervising the staff and activities of the Environmental Compliance, Contract Development and Environmental Permitting sections. The environmental compliance section ensures that all contaminated soil and groundwater issues that may be present within the confines of transportation projects are properly detected and addressed. Responsibilities often extend into the construction phase of a project. Environmental compliance is also responsible for coordinating clean-up activities associated with contaminated transportation sites. The contract development section prepares contract documents suitable for advertising through the review of project plans and specifications. The section ensures consistency, completeness, and compliance with federal and state policies. The Environmental Permit Coordination section acts as a liaison between the various design groups and the Office of Environmental Planning in order to gain efficiencies in the environmental permitting process. This includes working with designers to improve the quality of the permit applications as well as coordinating various initiatives with both Environmental Planning staff and the regulatory agencies. In addition to the requirements listed below, this position requires considerable knowledge of contemporary techniques, concepts and procedures employed in the field of environmental engineering, as applied to the Department of Transportation.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

KNOWLEDGE, SKILL AND ABILITY:

Considerable knowledge of relevant agency policies and procedures; considerable knowledge of relevant state and federal laws, statutes and regulations; considerable knowledge of latest techniques and procedures employed in field of engineering or land surveying as applied to Department of Transportation; considerable interpersonal skills; oral and written communication skills; considerable ability to interpret and apply principles of information systems and technologies; considerable ability to analyze and review engineering reports and plans; supervisory ability; considerable knowledge of principles and practices involved in transportation engineering such as bridge design, foundations, highway design, transportation facilities design, transportation planning, drainage or hydraulics, research, pavement design, pavement management, traffic and utilities; considerable knowledge of administrative and financial controls with respect to transportation engineering plans, contracts, projects and reports.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

General Experience: Nine (9) years of experience in complex transportation engineering projects.

Special Experience: One (1) year of the general experience must have been in a supervisor capacity over transportation engineering design projects. For state employees supervisory experience is interpreted at the level of Transportation Supervising Engineer (ENGINEERING).

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

Incumbents must possess Professional Engineer (PE) licensure from the Department of Consumer Protection State Board of Examiners for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors consistent with C.G.S. §20-302. Incumbents may be required to possess and retain a valid Motor Vehicle Operator's license and may be required to travel.

Eligibility Requirement: Candidates must meet the minimum qualifications listed above by the closing date of this posting. DOT employees who currently hold this title or those who have previously attained permanent status in this title since their most recent hire date, may apply for lateral transfer.
