PURPOSE OF CLASS: In the Department of Transportation this class is accountable for supervising Department of Transportation Maintenance Crew Leaders and Department of Transportation Supervisors (Bridge Maintenance) and their crews in the maintenance and betterment of transportation facilities.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

THIS PROMOTIONAL EXAMINATION IS OPEN TO ANY **CURRENT EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION WHO BY APRIL 14, 2011 HAS PERMANENT STATUS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE, SIX MONTHS SERVICE AT THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND THE FOLLOWING EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING***:

GENERAL EXPERIENCE: Six years of experience in bridge maintenance.

SPECIAL EXPERIENCE: Three years of the General Experience must have been in **supervisory capacity**. [Note: For state employees the Special Experience will be interpreted at the level of Department of Transportation Crew Leader (Bridge Maintenance).]

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Incumbents in this class may be required by the appointing authority to possess appropriate current licenses or permits.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: Incumbents in this class must have adequate strength, stamina and physical agility and visual and auditory acuity, and must maintain such physical fitness necessary for effective performance of the duties. A physical examination may be required.

WORKING CONDITIONS: Incumbents in this class may be exposed to extremes of weather conditions, to lifting of heavy weights, to highly dangerous road and traffic conditions, to exposure to heights when working on bridges, to poison ivy, insect bites and allergy irritants during summer months, and to loud and potentially dangerous machinery.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES (KSA's): Considerable knowledge of approved methods of maintaining and improving stationary and movable bridges and related structures; knowledge of the materials and equipment used in bridge maintenance and construction; ability to lay out, supervise and inspect bridge maintenance projects; considerable knowledge of relevant agency policies and procedures; considerable knowledge of relevant State and Federal laws, statutes and regulations; basic knowledge of first aid; considerable interpersonal skills; considerable oral and written communications skills; supervisory ability.

Make certain your application form clearly details your employment history, including job titles, dates of employment and actual job duties as well as college degrees earned and current licenses and certifications. **Mail applications to DAS/Human Resources, Room 404, State Office Building, 165 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut 06106-1658 (Secure Fax #860-622-2910).** If faxing materials, keep a copy of your completed application form and the fax transmittal receipt for your records. Make certain that your application form is complete and transmitted correctly and without error. Incomplete faxes or faxes received blank because pages were faxed upside down will not be accepted. Due to the large number of applications received, we cannot confirm receipt of applications. **Applications must be date stamped by DAS/Human Resources or postmarked by April 14, 2011. A separate application form must be submitted for each exam you are applying for.**
