ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT: Applicants must meet the Experience and Training requirements listed below in order to be considered. State employees currently holding the title of Transportation Supervising Engineer (Construction Engineering) or those who have previously attained permanent status may apply for lateral transfer.

JOB DUTIES:

There is a Transportation Supervising Engineer (Construction Engineering) position currently available in the Office of Construction, located in the Newington Administration Building. This position supervises staff in the Claims and Litigation and Alternative Contracting Sections.

The Claim and Litigation responsibilities relate primarily to administration of construction claims brought against the Department by contractors. Duties include self-performing or supervising other engineers reviewing and making recommendations related to the resolution of contractor monetary claims, draft time extensions, waivers of claim and releases; instructing District staff in the interpretation of contract specifications and dispute resolution; assisting District staff in schedule analysis; obtaining, assigning and supervising consultants; coordination of the financial needs of the unit; coordinating the analysis and resolution of construction issues and organization of design issue meetings; and other related duties.

Alternative Contracting Section responsibilities relate primarily to coordination of the administration of Alternative Contracting Methods for the Department. Duties include acting as a lead and/or supervising other engineers acting as team members related to the research and development of Design-Build, CMR, CMGC and other, manuals, preliminary plans, specifications, solicitations, contracts and other related documents; acting as a subject matter expert related to the processes for selection of project delivery methods as well as providing assistance and guidance during the procurement and construction phases of projects.

Duties common to both sections include conferring with and advising the Transportation Principal Engineer on all major highway, bridge, and vertical construction projects; serving as technical advisor on construction matters; initiating and assisting in the preparation of specifications, reports, and correspondence; meeting with contractors, consultant engineers, other state agencies, local and Federal officials; distributing, prioritizing, overseeing and reviewing unit work as assigned by a supervisor; providing staff training and assistance; conducting or assisting in conducting performance evaluations; acting as a liaison with other operating units, agencies, consultants, the contracting community and outside officials; recommending policies and standards; public speaking; and related duties as required.

PREFERRED KNOWLEDGE: Considerable knowledge of principles and practices of transportation construction engineering; considerable knowledge of highway and vertical construction methods and materials; considerable knowledge of relevant agency policies and procedures; knowledge of administrative and financial controls with respect to transportation construction administration; experience with ConnDOT Utility, Right of Way, and Design practices; experience with alternative contracting methods, performance specifications, and quality assurance in design and construction; considerable knowledge of relevant state and federal laws, statutes and regulations; considerable ability to analyze and review engineering reports, plans, specifications, and construction schedules; considerable interpersonal skills; considerable oral and written communication skills; supervisory ability.

EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

General Experience: Eight (8) years of experience in transportation construction engineering.

Special Experience: One (1) year of the General Experience must have been as an engineer with lead responsibility for complex transportation construction engineering projects in construction, surveys, or materials testing. For state employees this is interpreted at the level of Transportation Engineer 3 (CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING).

Special Requirements: 1. Incumbents must possess Land Surveyor (LS) licensure or Professional Engineer (PE) licensure from the Department of Consumer Protection State Board of Examiners for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors consistent with C.G.S. §20-302. 2. Incumbents may be required to possess appropriate certification from the New England Transportation Technician Program (NTTCP). 3. Incumbents in this class may be required to possess and retain a valid Motor Vehicle Operator's license. 4. Incumbents in this class may be required to travel.

Note: The filling of this position will be in accordance with reemployment, SEBAC, transfer, promotion and merit employment rules, if applicable. The candidate pool resulting from these interviews may be used to fill Transportation Supervising Engineer (Construction Engineering) vacancies that occur in the Office of Construction in Newington in the next twelve (12) months. Applications must be received by the closing date listed above. Late and incomplete application packages will not be considered.
