Important Information about Requests for Contracts

Executive Branch agencies who are required to come to the Department of Administrative Services/Procurement Division (DAS) for the administration of goods and services contracts (including Information Technology contracts), please be aware that **DAS is now required to have all of their contracts reviewed and approved by the Office of the Attorney General prior to contract execution.**

Given the additional time that is needed for this review, **Executive Branch agencies should be getting their contract requests (Core-10 or ITD-10) to DAS at least six months in advance of the current contract expiration** (additional time should be granted for major project contracts or other significant contracts). DAS Contracting staff will try to assist agencies by reminding them of their upcoming contract expirations, however, the responsibility for getting the request to DAS in a timely manner will be the responsibility of the agency.

DAS shall not be responsible for any delays in contract execution or lapses in contracts for requests that come to DAS less than six months in advance of the contract expiration or intended effective date for the new contract. DAS will be as flexible as possible for any current requests that haven't been sent to DAS yet for execution prior to August 1, 2013. Please work with your agency staff to ensure these time frames are met.
