STATE MARSHAL COMMISSION MEETING
December 1, 2010

Members present: Peter J. Martin, Esq. Chairperson; William W. Cote Esq., Vice Chairperson; Joseph P. Quinn, Jr., Esq.; Hon. William T. Cremins; Erron Smith; Joseph Ubaldi (joining at Old Business No. 2.) Michael Cronin, Esq. First Business:

1. October 27, 2010 minutes were adopted, after a motion by Hon. William Cremins, seconded by Vice-Chairperson William Cote, Esq., by a vote of 6-0, with Joseph Ubaldi not yet present.

2. The Commission, by a vote of 6-0, after a motion by Joseph Quinn, Jr., Esq., seconded by Erron Smith, the Commission voted to adopt the monthly meeting schedule for the Commission for 2011. Joseph Ubaldi was not yet present.

Old Business:

1. Update on Capias and Firearm Training/DSS letter

The Commission was apprised of the current status of the capias/firearm training. It was related that the training is sufficiently completed and that the approved list of state marshals on the capias unit will be sent to the Department of Social Services, Judicial, the insurance company and others as deemed appropriate.

2. Judicial Meeting/Topics

It was discussed that it would be beneficial for Management and staff of the State Marshal Marshal Commission, as well as Ex-Officios and key Marshal Advisory Board members to have a meeting with the Judicial Branch to discuss issues of mutual interest, including, but not limited to capias matters and protocol on inmate lawsuits.

New Business:

1. The Commission considered Ex-Officio member Thomas Burke's request for clarification on how Ex-Officio members can interact at the hearing level and later at the Commission deliberation level. It was clarified that if the Ex-Officio, or any Commission member, does not go under oath to testify for either a Complainant or Respondent, or add to the record, but is present to hear the public hearing, the Ex-Officio or Commission member can participate in the deliberations on the matter.

The Commission voted unanimously 7-0, after a motion by Michael Cronin, Esq., seconded by Hon. William Cremins, to go into Executive session to discuss personnel issues listed below. The individuals present included those listed above. The Commission voted unanimously 7-0, after motion by Joseph Ubaldi, seconded by Hon. William Cremins, to return to the public record.
