September 28, 2011

1. September 13, 2011 Minutes:

1. State Marshal Appointment needs by County

The Commission received a report from the State Marshal Advisory Board on a recommendation for how many new state marshals are needed in each county. Ex-Officios Marshal Lisa Stevenson and Marshal Thomas Burke, presented supporting information on the reasons for the numbers and the need for appointments in Hartford County soon. The Commission will make its official assessment on need numbers at the next meeting of the Commission, which is currently scheduled for October 26, 2011.

3. Lonnie Anderson Sentence. (public record)

The Commission was updated on the sentencing of Lonnie Anderson, who was convicted on 2 felony charges related to the shooting of Marshal Arthur Quinn. Mr. Anderson received an eleven year prison term, and special parole of 5 years on one charge and a 10 year prison term on the other felony.

The Commission, after a motion by Vincent Mauro, Jr., seconded by Michael Cronin, Esq., voted unanimously 5-0, to go into Executive session to discuss personnel issues listed below.
