## DATA CENTER PROJECT

The New Data Center Project consists of a building of approximately 25,000 square feet. The data center will power and cool the states computer and network equipment. Site requirements for parking are for a total of 8 to 10 spaces with 1 accessible space. There will be a freight loading dock with leveler completely separate from the employee parking and entryway. The facility will incorporate sustainable building design practices to optimize energy efficiency to lower cost and demand using a modular design approach.

### DATA CENTER ACTIVITIES

State of Connecticut's Enterprise Data Center operates 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year and provides the proper operating environment to support enterprise information technology infrastructure, services and support to Executive and Non-Executive Branch agencies. This includes the Judicial Branch and OSC, as well as political subdivisions and higher education. The State of Connecticut anticipates that a maximum of 8 employees will report to any one shift.
